5 Key Ways You Can Pray for Our Country Informed Prayer is Powerful Prayer

The United States of America boasts overwhelming military strength, a rich economy, and citizenship with great liberty. Nevertheless, nothing happens outside of the will of God Almighty. We may cast a ballot to elect leaders, and use emails and phone calls to influence legislation, but above all we should pray to the One who is in charge of all things (Daniel 2:20-23).

President George Washington proclaimed our nation's first day of prayer in 1789, saying, "It is the duty of all Nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor."

Truths to keep in mind while praying

We pray to a sovereign God.

He possesses supreme authority over all. The Apostle Paul poured out God's attributes in his letter to the Church in Colossae. He finishes with these words: "In Him all things hold together" (Colossians 1:15-20). Rather than taking matters into our own hands when faced with trials, we first appeal to the One who is in control.

We pray because it connects us with God.

The purpose of prayer is not to persuade God to fulfill a cosmic to-do list, but to be drawn into a conversation with God Himself. Through prayer we see His will more clearly and understand His heart for us and our nation more fully.

We pray for wisdom.

Governing is not easy. Our leaders are faced with complicated decisions every day—decisions that require sound wisdom. It is as important today as it was in 1797 at the Constitutional Convention, where Benjamin Franklin encouraged government leaders to pray for wisdom every morning, saying, "Have we now forgotten that powerful Friend? Or do we imagine we no longer

One Nation Under God

Pray for God to Be Lord of Our Country

Most of our founding documents are anchored in Scripture and Christian thought. The 1783 peace treaty with Great Britain that officially declared the U.S. free begins with the words, "In the Name of the Most Holy and Undivided Trinity."³ John Jay, Benjamin Franklin, and John Adams all signed it on behalf of the newly formed United States, indicating they held this belief sacred. Can we ever return to being a nation led by devout men and women whose moral and civil code is the Bible?

- Pray that our ever-growing and ever-changing economy will reflect the values of our founding and will also bring blessing to the rest of the world.

Pray for the President and Vice President

Years ago, reporters dubbed the President of the United States "the most powerful man on earth." With every passing term, the President and Vice President are under deeper scrutiny and are expected to weigh in on every cultural issue that arises, no matter how big or small. Our leader is expected to be perpetually wise, well-spoken, and confident. However, the President is still a human being who needs divine guidance and protection, just like the rest of us.

- Pray for the physical protection of the President and Vice President. Pray for their health, sleep, exercise, and nutrition.
- Pray that their words—whether given in national addresses or online—would be tempered, measured and wise.
- Pray that as topics and news cycles come and go, our leaders will remain focused on matters that are true, just, pure, lovely, and full of virtue (Philippians 4:8).
- Pray that the economy, abortion, border security, immigration, civil rights, health care, and more can be discussed and debated within the context of the total situation, not through opposing sound bites. Pray that God will use people and circumstances around the President and Vice President to reveal His truth.
- Thank God for the opportunity the United States has to influence other countries. Pray that in the President and Vice President's dealings with foreign leaders, they will be "wise as serpents and harmless as doves" (Matthew 10:16). Pray that their dealings with other nations will benefit individuals seeking religious liberty.

Article 1 of the U.S. Constitution addresses the creation of the bicameral legislature. Together, these two chambers—the House of Representatives and the Senate—form Congress. As our elected representatives write, debate and pass federal laws, it's also their duty to ensure those laws respond to our needs. Their job is important and impacts us every day, yet statistics demonstrate that many Americans don't even know the names of their elected representatives.

- Pray that they will seek clear and powerful legislation, not vehicles to which they may be tempted to attach frivolous or self-serving amendments.
- Pray that as debate and rhetoric surrounds the profoundly important policy issues of our day, wisdom and common sense will be present in full measure.

Judge Ourselves Rightly

Pray for the Federal and Supreme Courts

The idea of a "president" as chief executive is relatively new when considering all of recorded history. The idea of a senate dates back as far as the Roman empire. The idea of a judge, however, is one of the oldest roles of government and is the first discussed in Scripture.

Our Supreme Court Justices are appointed and confirmed for life. Voices in our culture often try to pigeonhole judges by predicting how they will rule on a narrow topic, but to make wise decisions, our judges need to see the entirety of an issue and how it integrates with thousands of others.

- Pray for our Supreme Court Justices as they hear controversial and divisive cases from lower courts.
- Pray that news outlets—and our nation as a whole—will listen to both majority and minority opinions offered in cases to better understand rulings.
